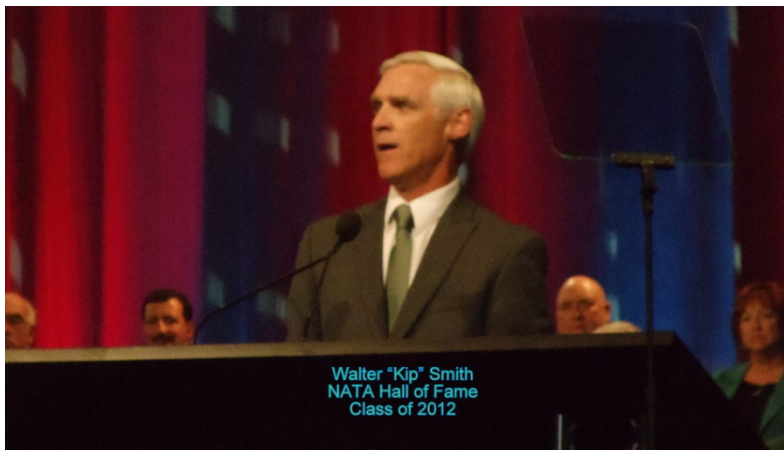

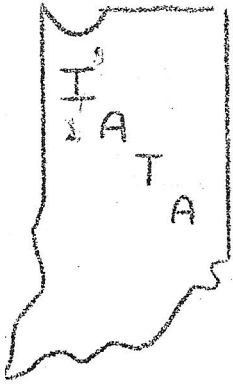
History and Archives Committee Seeking Help:
